

(NIV) The ESV says "For we are *his* workmanship, created in Christ Jesus *for* good works, which God prepared *beforehand*, *that we should walk in them*.

The theme for 2019 has been Serving the Least of These. At the Lenten Inspiration serving the people of St Matthew's in Chicago and families with Babies at St Paul in Mount Prospect were highlighted. The Fall Gathering provided an opportunity to visit displays for the Prayer Shawl Ministry at Holy Cross, the Family in Faith food pantry of Glendale Heights, the Friends in Christ, Morris Keep Your Kids in Shoes program, the many aspects of Bethesda and the opportunity to serve using Thrivent Action Teams.

A Year's worth of mission service activities calendar can be found in the righthand column after you click to see the current month's suggested activity. The calendar has three columns—nurturing faith in Christ, making our faith meaningful and sharing encouragement. November  Sive Thanks	Use the month of November to keep a "Thankfulness Journal". Each day write down one item for which you are thankful and don't forget to express your gratitude to those near you. Say a prayer of praise and thanksgiving to our creator, redeemer and sanctifier.	Work with your local Veterans' Administration (VA) hospital to see what the patients need in the way of clothing or other items. Organize a collection and then spend a day visiting with the recipients. Learn more about ministering to veterans at the <a href="LCMS Ministry to the Armed Forces">LCMS Ministry to the Armed Forces</a> page. You may also wish to provide audio <a href="Military BibleSticks">Military BibleSticks</a> to active service members. <a href="EXTRA CREDIT">EXTRA CREDIT: Find out what your local VA needs in the way of volunteers and then sign up!</a>	Identify the veterans and active military in your congregation and post their photos on a "wall of honor". Have a Veteran's Day lunch after church one Sunday in November to honor these heroes.
December	Be sure to use an advent devotion throughout the season. Involve your family and discuss each day's reading together.	Sponsor a parents' night out so that parents are able to do some Christmas shopping or decorating without little ones underfoot. Be sure to have licensed/certified babysitters on hand. EXTRA CREDIT: Involve the youth from the congregation in entertaining the children.	Provide guidance to families on how to keep "CHRIST" in "CHRISTmas", to slow down, and focus on what's important for children to learn. One idea is to make an <u>Advent Wreath</u> and use it as the focal point for Advent devotions.

Cool crisp mornings, trees adorned in red, gold and orange leaf, the sun taking its rest earlier each day all remind us that the church year is quickly coming to a close. In rapid succession we will celebrate the Reformation, go trick-or-treating, commemorate All Saints Day, and then stuff ourselves with Thanksgiving dinner. Before

we know it, Advent will be upon us and a new church year will have begun but...we aren't there yet.

We are in the final weeks of this prolonged season we call Pentecost. Green has adorned the altars and pulpits of many a sanctuary for a good number of months. Pentecost is referred to as the season of the church. The color green symbolizing growth as the Word of the Lord goes out through His church to all corners of the world. But let's be reminded how this season actually began - with the coming of the Holy Spirit - so perhaps we would be wise to think of Pentecost as the season of the Holy Spirit.


#### From President Jan Gerzevske:

# Zone 18 Fall Workshop

## **Operation Christmas Child**

Ten years ago, the LWML ladies of Zone 18 (formerly Zones 27 & 28) were looking for a worthwhile Fall Workshop project and were told about Operation Christmas Child, a mission of Franklin Graham's Samaritan's Purse organization, with the goal of bring shoe box gifts and the message of the Gospel to children around the world. The ladies decided this would be their project. Since that time, the undertaking has flourished.

With congregational support from each church involved, boxes and bags of school supplies, hygiene items, clothing, and toys arrived at the workshop by the car load. People had been collecting items all year for the exciting time when the items would be assembled in gift-wrapped or plastic shoe boxes that would be shipped overseas. Each box needed a monetary donation to help pay for shipping and *The Greatest Gift* book that is given to each child, published in their own language, telling them about Jesus. This money is generously donated by individuals and congregations at the Fall Workshop offering.

Since 2009, a total of 1530 boxes have been sent to Zimbabwe, India, Ukraine, South Africa, The Middle East, Botswana, Angola, Paraguay, Columbia, Malawi, Tanzania, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Togo, Ghana, Rwanda, and "hard to reach" areas where it would not be safe for workers if Christian efforts were re-

vealed.

At the Fall Workshop on October 5, 2019, we completed more than 150 additional boxes for this amazing outreach to help bring Christ's joy, peace, and hope to the ends of the earth. To God be the glory, great things he has done!

Ruth Ann Fulton of Trinity Lutheran Church in Goodfarm has been the project coordinator for Operation Christmas Child the last ten years. She puts in a great deal of time and energy to make this project so successful. All of us in Zone 18 would like to thank her for the wonderful job he has done.


