# NID (and National) Grant Highlight

Phil's Friends — Christian Cancer Care Packages \$10,000

Phil's Friends's mission is to provide Christ-centered support and hope to those affected by cancer. One of the ways they provide support is by giving a cancer care package that includes practical, comforting, and spiritual items (Bible included). The care packages are shipped free of charge or delivered to patients in Chicagoland hospitals. This grant has purchased the spiritual items in their care packages, including Bibles. The request for care packages was up 40% in 2019. This mission grant will allow Phil's Friends to provide Bibles and the message of the Gospel to a potential 2,800 more individuals affected by cancer. We have been able to pay this grant fully. Many will be receiving God's word during the most challenging and scariest battle of their life. Please remember to pray for Phil's Friends and their mission, along with those receiving their cancer care package.

Phil's Friends was also selected as a National Grant at the convention in June, pledged \$70,000!

# Running the Race... Looking to Jesus

Would we or wouldn't we? And if we did, what restrictions would there be? These were just two of the questions facing the 2021 LWML Convention Planning Committee, as well as women from all over the country who look forward to traveling to this event every other year. They come to praise God for the opportunity to serve Him, select new mission grants to fund, elect new officers, hear how their mite offerings are being used, and spend time with other sisters and brothers in Christ.

"Take it to the Lord in prayer..." — that's what everyone did, and God answered with a resounding "YES!" Our LWML was the first organization to host a convention in Lexington, KY, since the beginning of the pandemic! How did the members respond? 2,792 attended in person and over 3,800 more live-streamed some or all of the

sessions. "Praise God from whom all blessings flow!"

The theme of the convention was taken from Hebrews 12: 1-2: Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God. (ESV) It was hosted by the Indiana, Michigan, and Ohio Districts.

#### Here are some of the highlights:

- Thursday evening's Opening Service is always something that attendees look forward to, with thousands of voices praising God together and the opportunity to take Communion with so many other LWML sisters and brothers, as well as family and friends. The proclaimer was the Rev. Dr. David Maier, president of the LCMS Michigan District. He reminded us that it is just as important to finish the race as to start it, looking to God to be with us all the way.
- Friday morning's session began with the procession of District banners, carried by the District Presidents and accompanied by their Young Woman Representatives. President Jan Gerzevske carried our banner. With her were our YWR's Jamilyn Clausing, Ninette (Ponsolle) Robertson, Hannah Russell, and Emelia Waugh.
- The 2021-2023 Mission Goal (\$2,150,000) and grants had been selected by the eligible voters (using electronic balloting) prior to the Convention. 28 of the 34 proposed grants on the ballot will be funded over the next two years. Three of the grants have LWML NID connections: Phil's Friends, the Belize Mission Society, and Redeeming Life Outreach Ministries. A full list of the grants can be found on the national website (lwml.org) under "Missions" or on page 15.

- Everyone always enjoys the Saturday morning Mission Flag procession, which gives witness to the 82 (six new ones this year!) countries around the world where God has led the LWML to share His love and His Gospel message. The voters also elected new officers, pastoral counselor, and nominating committee for the coming biennium. Following the afternoon session, almost 1,100 LWML'ers took to the streets of Lexington for the Mission Walk, which raised over \$96,000 for mites.
- Among the items of business on Sunday morning before the adjournment and Sending Service was the invitation to the 2023 Convention in Milwaukee. The presentation was given by members of the three host districts: North Wisconsin, South Wisconsin, and Northern Illinois! We are very excited to be one of the hosts and look forward to seeing you there. There will be many opportunities to volunteer, or you can attend as a delegate or guest. There will be much more information available in the coming months, so be looking and listening for updates.

The goal statement of the Convention was "Looking to Jesus, we run the race set before us and proclaim the joy of the Lord." As we begin to meet again in our local groups and at zone and district events (The Fall Gathering is coming on September 25!), may we do so in His joy, trusting Him to guide and lead us as we continue to "serve the Lord with gladness!"

# NID-Bits Book Club — The Ebb Tide

**The Ebb Tide** by Beverly Lewis (Bethany House, 2017)

I'm not much of a beach girl myself, but Cape May sounds lovely! I enjoy armchair travel; it might not hold a candle to real travel, but it's certainly faster! Speaking of armchair travel, I loved Sallie's adoration of travel books and their ability to display amazing wonders of God's creation, especially those one may never see in person.



For much of the book, Sallie is in a tough position, having to choose between her family's dreams and expectations for her life, and the tugs she feels to follow a different path. Being Lutherans, rather than Old Order Amish, we don't generally have to make such drastic decisions, pitting the life to which God has called us against our church's rules. However, expectations can still be hard to disappoint, even when both options serve God. Perhaps it's as small as that your mother always taught second and third grade Sunday School, and everyone (including yourself) simply assumed you would take over eventually, but now there's going to be a women's Bible study at the same time, and you've been asked to help lead. It can be hard to step away from the long-expected, but sometimes God calls us to walk untrod paths.

Such paths often come with dead ends, or so such spots look at the time. But an impassable thicket may merely redirect your path, rather than end it. Little Aaron's pressing need, and Sallie's resultant abandonment of her Australian travel plans, led to Sallie's time in New Jersey, without which she may never have chosen to change churches and almost certainly never would have met Kevin. Speaking of Kevin, though Sallie's path to a life with him seemed to end with the close of summer, God guided them onward. We may not be able to see around the bends before us, but when we follow a path set by God, we can trust that He has good ahead.

As noted by so many characters in *The Ebb Tide*, prayer is essential to following the path God has set before each of us. I think they all affirmed that the best way forward is to "always pray and never give up." I loved that despite their initial disappointment, Sallie's family, especially her parents, recognized that she made her decision through prayer, just as they were praying for God's guidance for her life.


