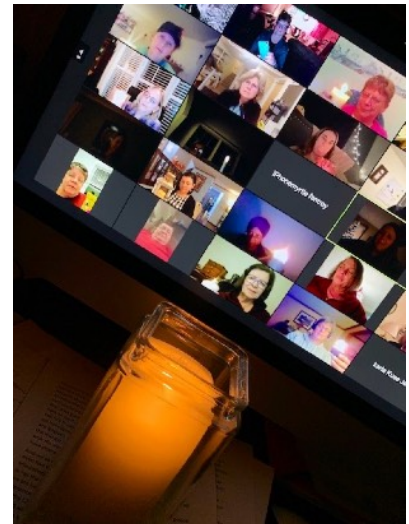


Fun This Winter

With the help of the LWML NID, the Lutheran Heritage Foundation will translate and publish several thousand books like Luther's *Small Catechism* and *Bible Stories in Pictures* in the languages of the people, which will be given free to the families and churches that need them.

Mama Bear Apologetics™

(Harvest House, 2019)



“...Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect.” (1 Peter 3:15 NIV)

This verse demands knowledge of Christian apologetics (reasoned arguments that explain our faith). It's easy to overlook the need for such knowledge, especially if, like me, nearly everyone you know is a Christian. Sure, a defense of the faith is necessary for evangelism and for times when we're challenged, but surely daily watchfulness isn't necessary, is it? *Mama Bear Apologetics™* dispels that dream pretty swiftly. It turns out that unbiblical philosophies have a way of sneaking into one's thinking, even through the use of redefined common language.

But fear not! With Christ as our foundation, our house will not fall, especially if we buttress the walls by thinking critically about the philosophies we come across on a daily basis. Speaking of those philosophies, I must say that I'd at least heard of most of the ones covered in the book, but I hadn't realized that Self-Helpism and Emotionalism are actual worldviews. Something like Pluralism (the belief that all religions are equally valid) is obviously antithetical to Christianity, but Self-Helpism? Huh? Following it to its ultimate conclusion, though, makes it clear that at the end of the day, the adherent of Self-Helpism becomes their own 'savior.' (That philosophy smacks of Buddhism to me, but I could be wrong.)

The statistics regarding the youth exodus (from churches) sound grim, as does the fact that there are apparently atheistic children's camps, as mentioned in chapter two, which train kids to argue against Christianity. (When I read that, I immediately thought of the Christian comedian Tim Hawkins's bit about "Atheist Kids' Songs," which can be found on YouTube if you're curious.) However, we have hope! Jesus is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. The Truth within us will not be overcome by the cultural lies that surround us. We will continue to be salt and light, though that may irritate some people, as mentioned in chapter four.

Are you prepared to answer for the hope within you?

(And don't forget that having kids at home is not a requirement to be a "Mama Bear." Every Christian woman can face down cultural lies that threaten our churches' kids!)
