Please welcome our new Young Woman Representative, Christa Petzold! She will be our new YWR to attend our National Convention in Milwaukee this year.



## Convention-al Wisdom

Are you preparing for the convention? Is this your first time going to a national convention? Ahead of the 2021 convention in Lexington, we asked the ladies who have attended previous conventions to share their tips on how to make the most of your time. Here is their Convention-al Wisdom:

My advice for a first time attendee to convention is bring a jacket or sweater for the convention floor because it is always cold.

LWML women are very warm hearted, but the convention centers tend to be chilly. Pack a sweater to wear during the sessions. Or check out the LWML store to purchase a sweatshirt or cardigan to keep you warm. Leave room in your suitcase to take home treasures from the convention. It is certain that you will go home with a strengthened faith and excitement to share Jesus with others.

#### Kris

I can still remember my first time at a national convention 1989 in Rapid City South Dakota. I barely knew ANYONE in district at that time. There were no Young Woman Reps, but I was 31 and a full time mother of 2 kids—the youngest was only 2 when I left them at home with my mother-in-law! Some of the women I roomed with are still part of my life [34] years later.

- 1. Sign up for EVERYTHING, especially eating meals together. Sit by anyone. I met people from all over the world!
- 2. Clothes to pack lots of purple, a sweater that can be jammed into your day bag because it is very cold in the building and so hot outside, comfortable walking shoes because from one activity to another could be a 10 minute walk INSIDE the convention center.
- 3. Note-taking tools the convention manual usually has a section to take notes and there also is a pad, but you may be the kind that does it better with an electronic device. But the info you get is so worth keeping. The Bible study takes on a whole new level when done with thousands of women by a nationally known Bible teacher.
- 4. Bring address labels! In the vendor section, the info booths of all the RSO's and other kinds of organizations will want to capture your info for drawings or you may want to follow something up with a new interest. They will probably want your cell phone number, too. You can trust that most of these organizations will send you newsletters, ask for donations, but probably will not sell your information to a third party (unlike other vendor fairs)
- 5. Take pictures so you can share with other ladies back home your experience.
- 6. Water bottle to refill in your room or a case of water to bring because of COVID they might not have the watering stations they have always had in the past. A hot beverage container to make something in your room and bring it to the convention floor. Concession stands can be expensive.
- 7. Be ready for the best adventure in your life with LWML!!!

We hope this helps you get ready—and excited—for your trip! Of course, the best part of any LWML get-together is praising God with our fellow Lutheran ladies, so relax and enjoy the fellowship, too.

# Trinity Lombard: We Finally Found Our 80!

At Trinity Lutheran Church in Lombard, Illinois, the women of the LWML struggled to find their "80" with which to mark the 80 years of Christian service and witness to God's unending love by the women of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod.



- We tried to make 80 cross favors for the upcoming national convention in Milwaukee. We ended up with 63.
- We joined in our Zone 6 collection of 80 boxes of adhesive bandages for the CLEF (Chicagoland Lutheran Educational Foundation) school nurse.
- We tossed around many ideas, and finally...

We bagged 80 muffins! In a bridge-building effort to reach non-church member families at Trinity Lutheran School in Lombard, LWML members handed out coffee, tea, and hot chocolate, along with a large bagged bakery muffin and a warmly worded invitation to join the Trinity family in worship during Easter and Holy Week. The primary objective was to make non-church member school families feel welcome and to know that Trinity Lutheran Church considers them "family." With the help of a Thrivent Action Team grant, ten LWML members—and one husband—met on the Monday evening of Holy Week and packed 80 muffins individually in brown lunch bags with napkins and a "You're Family" note. Early Tuesday morning, five of the women gathered to make hot coffee, chocolate, and tea. They loaded the hot carafes, lidded cups, and condiments onto carts, and set up serving stations at student drop off points to provide parents with a morning welcome as they delivered their students to school.

Of course, the crew bagged extra muffins and ensured that there was bottled water and fruit on hand, for those who preferred it. All the teachers, staff, and volunteers were treated, and even the election day workers serving next door in the church building's polling location received refreshments. Before calling it a day, the LWML team made and served hot cocoa with marshmallows to the entire student body.

It took Trinity's LWML quite a while to figure out their "80," but finally, hitting upon the idea, all agreed that it was the perfect project. It's almost certain that those on the receiving end think so too. The "curbside coffee" project will likely continue at Trinity as an ongoing annual reminder to all school families that Trinity's church members consider them FAMILY.

# **NID Mission Grant Highlight**

### Concordia Seminary, St. Louis—Increasing Student Enrollment \$8,000

Concordia Seminary's mission grant will help address The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod's (LCMS) considerable pastor shortage, which is jeopardizing faithful pastoral care to church members. In steadfastly working to counter this shortage, the Seminary has implemented comprehensive efforts to significantly increase pastoral student enrollment. Northern Illinois's support will help the Synod to continue and expand these ongoing initiatives, enabling them to attract more students who will study diligently to become pastors for our church body.

One of the current Master of Divinity students who visited the Seminary while in college said, "I was given a tour of the campus, met with students, and sat in on two classes. I could tell these students had a strong sense of community, both as students and in knowing each other personally. I also met with two professors and, in speaking with them, I felt my questions and concerns were cared about and my questions were valued."

## 2022-2024 NID Mission Grants

The delegates to the LWML NID Convention last September voted to approve the proposed mite goal of \$160,000. \$98,000 will fund our district's grants. This goal, if met, along with a \$1,000 transfer from last biennium's surplus, will allow us to fully fund nine mission grants!

### Concordia Seminary, St. Louis—Increasing Student Enrollment

\$8,000

Concordia Seminary asked for a mission grant to help them address The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod's (LCMS) considerable pastor shortage that is jeopardizing faithful pastoral care to church members.

### Northern Illinois District Life Task Force: Spreading the Gospel of Life \$9,000

The grant will enable the Life Task Force to offer more, and affordable, opportunities within each region of the Northern Illinois District to educate many more people on Life Issues and empower them to take up the Christian cause for life in Illinois.

### **Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch**

\$4,000

The gift from the Northern Illinois District will be used as part of a larger project to transform the Kruse Memorial Chapel, creating a more trauma-sensitive, child-friendly environment that engages at-risk children, facilitating growth in the Gospel and Christ-centered healing.

#### **Lutheran Bible Translators**

\$15,000

The majority of the Subula people of Cameroon are Muslims. The Subula people are eager for a revised version of the New Testament and for the Old Testament to be translated. Lutheran Bible Translators requested \$15,000 to translate fifteen chapters of Scripture to put God's Word in the hands of the Subula people.

Walcamp \$18,000

Walcamp's pavilion is used by many of their programs, as well as many user groups. A few local congregations utilize this area for Vacation Bible School, while another uses the area for a large congregation camp out. They are planning on adding a serving kitchen to the structure.

MOST Ministries \$8,000

MOST Ministries enables committed Christians to go on short-term missions and share God's love through both witness and acts of service. This grant will enable MOST Ministries to cover the cost of attending the Team Leader Training Orientation and one Team Leader Retreat for four Team Leader Trainees who begin their training in 2023 and 2024 (four Team Leader Trainees in each year).

#### **Trinity Lutheran Church and School of Tinley Park**

\$10,668.90

Trinity Lutheran School is remodeling a room to be a "maker space" with building and crafting material storage along the walls. They will purchase new technological learning materials, and open up the room so students can collaborate together and explore the world God created.

LINC Chicago \$16,340

LINC's goal is to find leaders in Chicago neighborhoods with God-given dreams who want to impact their communities with the Gospel and to raise up the next generation of church planters, multi-ethnic leaders, and urban missionaries. Funding will enable them to continue to engage, equip, and empower current LINC leaders as well as leaders yet to be recruited.

Voice of Care \$10,000

Voice of Care will provide a district-wide high-level Respite and Companion Care Training program for church workers and lay volunteers. They are poised to train 175 individuals to provide much-needed qualified short term respite care to families and individuals.
