There is someone, though, whom we can count on to always be kind and consistently treat us with mercy – not because in any way, shape or form do we deserve His mercy, leniency or sympathy for our actions, but because of the love He has for us. MOST Ministries, a Recognized Service Organization of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod , sends 30 to 40 missionary teams per year into Mites fund Grants. Grants fund Ministry Projects.

countries around the world at the request of national churches in partnership with LCMS, or LCMS missionaries, to minister to the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of the people. Virtually all of the people in these mission fields speak other tongues than English making interpreters essential for communication. Whether the work involves a Vacation Bible School, a medical clinic, providing and installing water filters, the work cannot be done easily, or the Gospel spread, without someone to bridge the language barrier. This grant provides funds to give minimal stipends to the individuals who serve as interpreters.

Since the NID convention in September 2016, three teams have made use of funds to provide small stipends for people who served in this vital role. To date \$1100 has been dispersed. The grant of \$10,000 will certainly return great benefits through this outreach. Thank you to the women of the LWML Northern Illinois District for sharing mites that support this outreach.

"Lord, Have Mercy"

God's mercy is found throughout the Bible. One of the signature moments, which describe the mercy of God is found in Exodus 34:6, 7. Following the Golden Calf incident, God threatened to destroy the people of Israel rather than forgive them (Exodus 32:10). But God relented; He was faithful even when the people were not.

With this in mind, let us take a look at some of the words from Exodus 34:6, 7 and how God Himself describes the mercy that He provides.

Exodus 34:6, 7

Then the Lord passed by in front of Moses and proclaimed, "The Lord, the Lord God, compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in lovingkindness and truth; who keeps lovingkindness for thousands, who forgives iniquity, transgression and sin." (NASB)

- Compassionate God is filled with loving sympathy for human frailty.
- Gracious God shows mercy even to those who do not deserve it.
- Slow to anger God gives the sinner ample time to reflect, repent, and confess.

• Abundant kindness – God is kind to those who lack personal achievements and He provides more gifts and blessings than deserved.

• Preserves kindness to generations – God will never forget His words of kindness and mercy toward future generations.

As we reflect on the mercy of God let us also remember that we have been called into "the fellowship of His Son" (1 Corinthians 1:9). The grace and mercy shown to us is not from some far away God but rather from One who is near – whose Spirit dwells in us – and who has given us the highest Christian privilege called fellowship. And one of the gifts of this fellowship with God is to embrace the mercy that Jesus Christ freely gives.

St. Paul writes, "When you were dead in your sins and in the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive with Christ. **He forgave us all our sins.**" (Colossians 2:13, emphasis added). This union with Christ is connected to our forgiveness. And if then the life we live is "hidden with Christ in God" (Colossians 3:3), then we can never be "sinfully condemned." Therefore, it is written, "there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus" (Romans 8:1) and no one can lay a charge against any of God's saints (Romans 8:33).

Indeed, as the Holy Spirit prepares us to enter into another season with the Lord, let us pray that we see our Savior's mercy with "fresh eyes" and give praise to God because we are *eternally forgiven for everything*!
